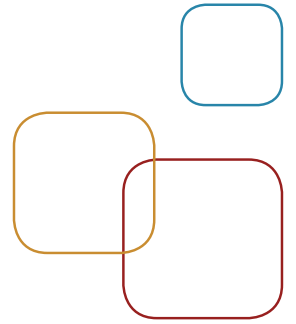




FIRST RESPONDER DISABILITY AWARENESS TRAINING



WHAT:

The North Dakota Center for Persons with Disabilities in conjunction with the Ohio Disability & Health Program has produced a **one-hour training for first responders on working with people with disabilities**. This course has been designed to provide first responders with the information and methods that will help to ensure effective and appropriate communication between first responders and people with disabilities.

WHO:

This training is for law enforcement, firefighters, nurses, and EMTs/paramedics.

WHERE:

The free course is available **online** at www.ndcpd.org/first-responder.html.

This training has been approved for one hour credit through North Dakota Peace Officer Standards and for the LCCR credit hours through ND EMS System, a Division of Emergency Medical Systems. A certificate of completion will be issued following training and post-survey completion.

The first 100 individuals completing the course will receive the 5th Edition Tip Sheet for First Responders that was developed by the State of New Mexico Governor's Commission on Disability to enhance their training.
