Red Flags for Autism Spectrum Disorders

6 months	No big smiles or joyful facial expression
9 Months	No reciprocal sharing of sounds, smiles or facial expressions
12 months	No babbling, reciprocal sharing of gestures (pointing, reaching, waving)
15 months	No words
24 months	No two word meaningful phrases without Imitation or repetition
Any Age	Any loss of speech/babbling or social skills
