However, the quality of the content is more important than the length. Please type your answers if possible.
- Provide samples and documentation used to enhance your portfolio.
- Examples of these types of projects include:
 - a. Devise or submit a comprehensive plan for **assessing** support environments AND **developing recommendations** for altering support environments to nurture appropriate adaptive behavior. Direct support, mid-managers, and people served should be included in developing and implementing the plan (See pages 17 and 47-49 of the module for examples of elements to include in your assessment).
 - b. Develop or submit and conduct training for direct support staff on how to implement a positive behavior support plan. Monitor implementation of the support plan and provide appropriate support during at least two follow-up visits one week later and again one month following the training.
 - c. Complete a functional assessment using at least one new data collection tool/approach, i.e., interview, scatter plot, etc.
 - d. Use the Competing Behavior Model during a team meeting to brainstorm <u>at least three</u> of the following for a person with challenging behavior:
 - Setting event interventions
 - Antecedent interventions
 - Replacement behavior interventions
 - Consequence interventions
 - e. Develop or submit a list **describing** potential *Quality of Life Enhancements* (page 50 from the module) for at least three people you support.
 - f. Develop a teaching plan for skills targeted as replacement skills for a person you support. Include your rationale for selecting the replacement skills you plan to teach. The teaching plan should include (See chapters 6 and 8): teaching methods, instructional prompts/cues, feedback, error correction, reinforcement options and schedule, and data collection plans.
