

What is considered an underlying medical condition for severe COVID-19?

Adults of any age with certain underlying medical conditions are at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19 and may influence what priority group you fall under regarding COVID-19 vaccine. It is important to note that the underlying medical conditions listed below are not an exhaustive list and only include conditions with sufficient evidence to draw conclusions. Individuals with any underlying medical conditions (including those NOT on the list below) should consult with their healthcare provider about their own personal risk factors associated with illness from COVID-19.

Underlying medical conditions that put you at increased risk for potential severe and lifethreatening outcomes from COVID-19 infection:

- Cancer
- Chronic lung disease, including COPD
- Serious heart conditions e.g. heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies (also known as heart muscle disease)
- Obesity with a body mass index (BMI) of 30 or more
- Type 2 diabetes
- Chronic kidney disease

- Conditions that cause you to be immunocompromised - e.g. HIV infection or those with weakened immune systems due to other illnesses or medication
- Sickle cell disease
- Pregnancy
- Smoking
- Down Syndrome

Underlying medical conditions that might put you at increased risk for potential severe and lifethreatening outcomes from COVID-19 infection:

- Asthma (moderate to severe)
- Cerebrovascular disease (affects blood vessels and blood supply to the brain)
- Cystic fibrosis
- Hypertension (high blood pressure)
- Neurologic conditions, such as dementia
- Liver disease
- Overweight (BMI of 26-29)
- Pulmonary fibrosis (having damaged or scarred lung tissue)
- Thalassemia (a type of blood disorder)
- Type 1 diabetes

It is important that individuals have a conversation with their provider regarding which priority group they fall under. Just because a condition is not listed above, *does not mean it does not put you at higher risk for severe outcomes from COVID-19 infection*. Each situation is unique and should be decided on a case-by-case basis between a patient and their healthcare provider.
