When writing the Medicare Basics for American Indians handbook, SMP received input from Tribal Liaisons and other tribal community members.

Food for Thought

Cookie Salad **Ingredients:**

- 1 cup buttermilk.
- 1 package instant banana cream pudding
- 8 oz. carton Cool Whip
- 15 oz can mandarin oranges, drained
- 20 oz can pineapple tidbits
- 1/2 package Fudge Stripe cookies, broken up
