### SMP Volunteer Risk & Program Management

The Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) program depends on volunteers to help people who use Medicare. Without good volunteer rules, it can be hard for SMPs to find and work with volunteers.

The Administration for Community Living (ACL) created rules for volunteers to better organize and manage the SMP's volunteer program. These rules explain the values and ideas that guide how volunteers work, set expectations for managing volunteer programs, and explain what volunteers can expect from SMP. The goal of these rules is to make the program safer, more effective, and better overall by giving clear directon to both staff and volunteers. These rules also match the SMP's mission and help make sure volunteers have a positive, ethical, and productive experience.

The next quarterly newsletter will talk about certain rules and policies and why they matter for volunteering.

### **Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, & Accessibility**

Diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) are more than just fancy words. DEIA means making sure everyone feels treated fairly and welcomed, no matter their background. But why is DEIA important in Senior Medicare Patrol program? It helps create respect, fairness, and a sense of belonging for people who might feel left out in the community. The goal is to reach out, teach, and support people from all kinds of backgroundsdifferent races, abilities, genders, religions, languages, and cultures—using ways that make sense to them.

# **Food for Thought**

#### **Champagne Breakfast Bake Ingredients:**

- 2 1/2 C. croutons
- 2 C. Shredded cheese
- 2 # Jimmy Dean Sausage (1 hot, 1 mild)
- 2 1/2 C. Milk
- 6 eggs
- 3/4 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 can cream of celery soup

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Place croutons in greased 9x13 pan.
- 2. Top with cheese. Brown sausage, drain. Pour over cheese.
- 3. Beat eggs, mustard & 2 1/2 C. milk. Pour over meat.
- 4. Cover & refrigerate overnight.
- 5. In the morning, mix 1/2 C. milk with celery soup.

Pour over top.

6. Bake in 325 degree oven for 1 1/2 hours. Cover with foil for first half of baking.

1/2 C. milk

7. Serves 6-8.
