"I Never Asked for That": Story of a Medicare Scam

Margaret (not her real name), a widow living in Minot, thought it was just another phone call. "The caller said they were from Medicare," she recalled. "They even knew my name and address." The caller told me they would pause my benefits unless I confirmed my Medicare number.

Worried, she gave them the information, thinking she was protecting her coverage. Two weeks later a box appeared on her doorstep. Inside the box were knee braces, back supports, and diabetic test supplies—things she didn't order and didn't need. "I don't have diabetes, so I thought it was just a mistake. Then my neighbor told me it might be a scam." She checked her Medicare statement and was shocked to see that someone had billed over \$2,400 in her name for the equipment. Even worse, several companies she had never heard of claimed to be the providers.

Margaret called Medicare, and the person she talked to said she had been tricked by a scam. They told her to contact her local SMP office where someone could help her:

- Report the fraud to the Office of Inspector General (OIG)
- File a dispute for the false claims
- Request a new Medicare number to protect against further abuse.

It took nearly three months of phone calls, letters, and follow-up, but with help, Margaret finally had the fraudulent charges reversed and received a new Medicare number. Margaret's message to others...don't ever give out your Medicare number over the phone, even if they sound official. If it feels rushed or scary, hang up and call someone you trust.

Protect yourself like Margaret did:

- Medicare will never call to ask for your number or threaten to cancel your benefits.
- If something seems suspicious, hang up immediately.
- Contact ND SMP at 1-833-818-0029 or 1-800-Medicare for help.
- Always review your Medicare statements for unknown charges.
